BUS L311 Law for Entrepreneurs: Taught and developed an upper-level course curated each year for students' specific interests and needs. The course teaches students how to navigate the legal issues they may face as entrepreneurs.

BUS L310 Law of Personal Finance: Taught and developed an upper-level course surveying the rights and duties of owners, debtors, and creditors affecting the decisions of business managers, accounting professionals, and financial planning advisors.

BUS L375 Intro to Business Ethics: Taught and developed honors and non-honors versions of a business ethics class surveying various philosophical frameworks that may guide human behavior within organizations.

BUS L100 Personal Law: Taught and developed a survey course focused on the cradle-to-grave legal issues people face. It is designed to push students to reflect on their roles as citizens and to be empowered when confronted with legal problems and opportunities.

BUS C550 Law and Ethics for Business: Taught and developed a graduate-level course focused on a managing the legal aspects of business, with a special emphasis on world and political affairs impacting the legal environment of business.

BUS X521 Decision-Making and Leadership: Taught and developed a graduate-level course designed to raise student awareness about their own cognitive biases and failings as decisionmakers in order to help them better process information, make arguments, and lead.

BUS L272 Global Emerson: Business and Human Rights: Assisted Professor Jamie Prenkert with his global emersion course by guiding small-group class discussions and mentoring and supervising students while on a ten-day educational trip to South Africa.

Global Business Institute: Assisted in developing and teaching the curriculum for a month-long, intensive entrepreneurship boot camp for students from across the Middle East and North Africa. The program was highly selective (only 1% of applicants accepted) and sponsored by Kelley, the U.S. Department of State, and the Coca-Cola Company.
